Use this worksheet to gather the information you need to complete the [Do-It-Yourself Revoke Paternity Established by Marriage](#). The more information you have when you begin, the faster you can finish and get your forms.

Information about Court Cases

Is there a child support order requiring your husband (or ex-husband) to pay child support for this child? If so, you will need to know:

- The case number
- The court where the case was filed
- The date the judge signed the order

Is there a pending (ongoing) or finished divorce, separate maintenance, or family support case between you and your husband? If so, you will need to know:

- The case number
- The court where the case was filed
- The judge's name
- Whether you are the Plaintiff or Defendant
- If your husband has a lawyer in that case, the lawyer's address and phone number

If there has **not** been a divorce, separate maintenance, or family support case, has there ever been any other case involving child support, parenting time, or custody of your child in a Michigan court? If so, you will need to know:

- The case number
- The court where the case was filed
- The judge's name
- Whether you are the Plaintiff or Defendant
- If your husband has a lawyer in that case, the lawyer's address and phone number

Other Cases

If you do not have any of the cases listed above, you will need the following information:

Are there any other pending or resolved cases in family court involving you and your husband? If so, you will need to know:

- If the case is still active
- The case number
- The court where the case was filed
- The judge's name

Has there ever been an abuse or neglect case (child protective case) involving your child? If so, you will need to know:

- The case number
- The court where the case was filed

Has there ever been a juvenile delinquency case involving your child? If so, you will need to know:

- The case number
- The court where the case was filed

Is there any other Michigan court with continuing jurisdiction over your child? If so, you will need to know:

- The case number
- The court where the case was filed

Other Information

The full name of your child's biological father

The biological father's address and telephone number (You will only need this information if you want the judge to sign a court order naming the biological father as the new legal father.)
